




U.S. Senator Mark R. Warner invites Virginia high school students to consider applying for the United States Senate Page Program.

The United States Senate Page
Program allows students a
unique opportunity to learn about
Congress while continuing with
their coursework.



The office of U.S. Senator Mark R. Warner appreciates the chance to share the details of the Senate Page Program with Virginians.

Senate Pages play an important role in the day-to-day operations of the Senate; their primary responsibility involves supporting Senators in the Senate Chamber when Congress is in session.

During the fall and spring semesters, Pages will attend early morning classes at the United States Senate Page School, which is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. Classes start at 6:15am and curfew is at 9:00pm Sunday through Thursday and 10:00pm Friday and Saturday. However, Pages are required to stay in the Senate until it is adjourned, which can be well after curfew.

Senator Warner nominates one student in the fall and one in the spring and does not nominate pages in the summer due to program restrictions. Additionally, Senator Warner's page sponsorship alternates by gender.

With only 30 Pages per session, these nominations are highly competitive and, unfortunately, not all students who seek a position can be accommodated.



Exceptional high school juniors with a strong interest in history and government, and a passion for public service are strongly encouraged to apply.

In order for your application to be considered you must:

- Be a junior in high school
- Be 16 or 17 years old on or before the date of appointment
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Be a citizen of the United States or subject to agreements of the Department of State, and have a Social Security number



Additionally, qualified candidates must be willing and able to leave their school and all extracurricular activities for the fall or spring semester of their junior year to come live in the Webster Hall Page dorm and attend the Page school.

Webster Hall is located just two blocks away from the Hart Senate Office Building, right on Capitol Hill. Pages share furnished rooms designed for four to six occupants. Pages are given a stipend to cover the costs of room and board.

Pages play an important role in the day-to-day operation of the Senate. Their schedule can be long and tedious, and requires tremendous endurance; good health and stamina are requirements which cannot be waived.

Pages are also required to be covered by health insurance; if not covered, they will be required to enroll in the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program.
